Fruit/other Perennials (most die back late summer or fall) Whole **Flowers** Leaves Aesclepias eriocarpa (milkweed) Perennial to 2ft; covered in white hairs; leaves opposite, folded, wavy, to about 5"; pink flowers in late spring; fruits open to release seeds with fluffy white hairs; food plant for Monarch butterfly caterpillars; dies down in late summer Chloragalum pomeridianum (soap plant) Perennial, dies down in late summer; clump of leaves from which arises a tall flowering stalk; leaves wavy to 1ft; flowers white to 1" wide, open in evening, on stalk to 6ft Croton californicus (croton) Perennial to 2ft x 2ft; leaves hairy, light green, to about 2"; small cream flowers either male or female Male flowers Female flowers and fruit
